# TOGETHER

The Institute for Nonprofit News' editorial collaborations increase the reach, impact, and sustainability of nonprofit news. Serving communities across the country, these editorial initiatives make reporting and longterm changes possible that otherwise wouldn't happen. INN's unique approach:

- > Using innovative methods to reach and inspire action among those closest to these issues.
- > Counteracting parachute journalism by relying on the expertise and accountability of community-rooted outlets.
- > Building a more equitable future by advancing best practices that prioritize diverse perspectives and experiences.

Since 2019, 90 news outlets have participated in INN editorial collaborations, investigating pressing issues such as climate change, access to health care and educational barriers. In 2022 and 2023, INN distributed over \$670,000 total in reporting, engagement and editing stipends to outlets participating in INN collaborations.


To address community information needs and drive newsroom sustainability, we are building on this strong foundation, starting in rural America.

# MEANINGFUL CHANGE

A new law is squarely confronting what's causing the ground beneath a town to collapse following a report in INN's collaborative series Tapped Out.

Original reporting from <u>SJV Water</u> showed that pumping of underground water for irrigation was causing a California farming town to sink.

After the story was published in partnership with the <u>Center for Collaborative Investigative Journalism</u> and <u>The New York Times</u> — with funding from the Water Desk, the Fund for Investigative Journalism and Ensia — the county board of supervisors took a hard look at the activity of agricultural companies.

In November 2022, <u>the board passed an ordinance</u> in effort to stop groundwater being mined and sold

outside its borders. The change came despite opposition from entities tempted by the monetary benefits of pumping.

Pairing SJV Water's deep expertise with partners' resources for a massive investigation meant the town has gained new protection.

Climate and environmental issues have long been a focus of INN collaborations. Following Tapped Out, INN facilitated **Tapped Out 2**, another collaboration looking at water-thirsty communities in the West. In August 2023, **Inundated**, examined flooding vulnerability in the Great Lakes region with stories co-published by The Guardian. An earlier, award- winning Great Lakes collaboration, **Rust to Resilience**, highlighted climate solutions in the region.
